GLACIER BIKE TOUR.

New Cycling Tour Highlight across Switzerland.

The Glacier Bike Tour is a new cycling tour highlight tailored for e-bike enthusiasts. The 10 stages lead along the route of the iconic Glacier Express – the world's slowest express train – from St. Moritz via Andermatt to Zermatt, right across Switzerland. The GBT spans 370 kilometers and 9,500 meters in altitude, crosses three mountain passes and traverses three cantons. The project is a collaboration of Graubünden, Uri and Valais and thus provides a seamless infrastructure across the canton borders.

Designed for e-bike touring.

The Glacier Bike Tour is neither a traditional long-distance cycle route nor the usual trans alp. The route was specifically developed for the new target group of e-bike tourers. In recent years, the powerful and comfortable EMTBs (also referred to as e-SUVs) have seen a remarkable growth, surpassing most other bike categories. With its mix of gravel, asphalt, and easy trails, the Glacier Bike Tour is the ideal fit for the new "e-SUV" riders. Plus, the stage length of 3-4 hours caters to touring cyclists who want to merge athletic activity with experiencing nature and culture, the country and its people.
